## PAID EXTERNSHIPS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STAFF

The Rock Externship Program offers Rock County high school staff hands-on industry experience through a one-week summer immersion in local businesses. Targeted at CTE, STEM, and counseling staff, it helps integrate real-world insights into lesson plans. Participants receive a \$1,000 stipend upon completing requirements, including onboarding, daily journaling, and a post-program development session. Applications are due April 4, 2025, with priority for first-time participants. Repeat applicants may be accepted if space allows. Those leaving Rock County's education network post-program must repay the stipend. This initiative is supported by local employers, Blackhawk Tech, and Rock County partners.

## **PARTICIPATION & ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Must be an employee in good standing of any public or private school high school in Rock County, WI
- Participants must commit to attend all program related activities to be eligible for the full amount of the program's stipend.
- Participants must commit to remain gainfully employed with their school district or within Rock County's K-16 workforce
- Commit to incorporate and document insights and experiences gleaned during the program
- Agree to collaborate, engage and share information with their host worksite and the Externship Coordinator - during and after the completion of their externship week.
